Guidelines for Collaborating with External Units to Organize Degree Programs

March 31, 2009 Passed by the 2,568th Administrative Meeting

- Article 1 National Taiwan University (NTU or "the University") formulate the NTU Guidelines for Collaborating with External Units to Organize Degree Programs ("the Guidelines") as the framework for colleges when organizing degree programs in collaboration with external teaching or research units.
- Article 2 When a college intends to establish a degree program in collaboration with external teaching or research institutions, it shall submit a proposal for the degree program to the university for approval. The proposal shall encompass the following details:
 - 1. External collaborating units
 - 2. Name of the degree program
 - 3. Reasons for collaborative establishment of the degree program
 - 4. Participating faculty
 - 5. Proposed enrollment quotas and sources
 - 6. Operational methods, degree conferment, and the form of collaboration with external units
- Article 3 The college's collaborative organization proposal shall be submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs. It shall undergo a review by the Office of Academic Affairs and the Office of Research and Development, which shall provide review opinions and suggestions. After the college responds to the opinions and suggestions, the Office of Academic Affairs shall submit the revised proposal to the President for approval.
- Article 4 Upon approval by the President, the college may proceed to discuss relevant details with the external units involved, prepare a project proposal, and follow internal procedures in accordance with Article 7 of the NTU Regulations Governing the Establishment, Alteration, Merger, and Cessation of Teaching and Research Units.

Article 5 The Guidelines shall be passed by Administrative Meeting and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
