

NATIONAL TAIWAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM Intercollegiate Double Major and Minor Study Regulations

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- Article 1 To open the learning horizons of students of the universities of the NTU System (National Taiwan University, National Taiwan Normal University, and National Taiwan University of Science and Technology, hereinafter referred to as “the Three Universities”), and to expand students’ fields of study, promote intercollegiate cooperation, and make good use of the resources and equipment of the Three Universities, these Regulations have been formulated in accordance with the *University Act* and the relevant laws and regulations.
- Article 2 The term intercollegiate double major and minor in these Regulations refers to students currently enrolled in an undergraduate program in one of the Three Universities who have applied to one of Three Universities for the study of a double major or minor in a department not offered by their home university.
- Article 3 When applying for intercollegiate double major or minor study, students shall meet the requirements given by both universities and receive permission from the department in their home university. Matters of application qualifications, application time periods, courses for study, and academic credits shall be handled in accordance with the regulations of the department of the second university.
- Article 4 Matters of course selection and credits fees in intercollegiate double major or minor study shall be handled following the agreements set forth by the Three Universities regarding intercollegiate course selection. Students enrolled in intercollegiate double major or minor courses, in addition to tuition and miscellaneous fees (including academic credit fees), shall also be required to pay any additional lab, individual instruction, or usage fees, etc. in accordance with regulations of the department of the second university.
- Article 5 For students who apply for an intercollegiate double major or minor study, matters including the handling of student status, the calculation of semester grades, total credit limits, the number of failed courses needed for expulsion, and application for the extension of a completion of studies shall all be handled in accordance with the academic rules and regulations of the student’s home university.

- Article 6 During their intercollegiate double major or minor study, if students have previously taken and passed courses similar, or the same, as those required by the department in the second university, whether or not such courses shall be considered transferable shall be determined by the student's department in their home university and the department in the second university. If the credits cannot be applied in this manner, or there is a discrepancy in the number of credits, the department in the second university may prescribe further courses for the student so as to make up for any differences in credits. A written report shall also be submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs in the students' home university for reference.
- Article 7 Being approved for intercollegiate double major or minor study and having met all the conditions required for the conferment of a degree in their home university, and having been verified by the department of the second university to have finished all courses and met all conditions for an intercollegiate double major or minor study, students shall be conferred with a diploma by their home university in which their intercollegiate double major or minor shall be noted. However, if for any reason, students are unable to receive a degree from the department in their home university, they may not ask to be awarded the qualifications of an intercollegiate double major or minor and may not receive a graduation diploma from the second university. If intercollegiate double majors are unable to meet or decide to give up their qualifications for a double major, depending on the regulations of the department in the second university, credits for courses already enrolled and passed, if they meet the qualification for a minor in the department in the second university, may qualify the student for that minor.
- Article 8 If students who applied for an intercollegiate double major or minor study are unable to continue their studies for any reason, in accordance with the regulations of the second university, they shall submit an application to abandon their studies with the application to be sent to the Office of Academic Affairs in both their home and second universities. If the student does not achieve or gives up the qualifications for a double major or minor, whether courses already taken may count towards the graduation requirements of the student's original department shall be handled in accordance with the regulations as given by said department.
- Article 9 Matters not covered in these Regulations shall be handled in accordance with academic rules of the student's home university and any relevant regulations concerning double major and minor study.
- Article 10 These Regulations, and any ensuing revisions, shall be announced and implemented following its passage at a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee of the Three Universities, with a report to be later sent to the Ministry of Education for reference.
